Term 1:

Students will write a <u>midterm</u> exam. By <u>November 19</u>, students will be issued a Progress Report with comments on their learning progress, behavior and subject-specific competencies. At the <u>end of term</u>, students will write an exam that will count for 20% of their TALK, READING and PRODUCTION <u>term</u> marks.

Term 2:

At <u>midterm</u>, students will write an exam. By <u>April 22</u>, students will be issued a Progress Report with comments on their learning progress, behavior and subject-specific competencies. At the <u>end of term</u>, students will write an Evaluation Situation (ES) from the MEQ that will count for 20% of their overall <u>final</u> READING and PRODUCTION marks. The TALK evaluation will be done in-school and count for 20% of their overall final TALK mark.
