Term 1

By October 15th, students will be issued a **Progress Report Card** with comments on their learning progress, behavior, and subject-specific competencies. By **November 20**, students will have been issued a Report Card.

Term 2

Students will write midyear exams that will count for 20% of their term marks. By **March 15**, students will be issued a Report Card.

Term 3

At the end of term, students will be given End Of Year Exams during class as well as MEQ exams the examination period. This exam will be worth 20% of the overall grade. Since the exam is moderated, a grade of 60% is required to pass the course. Students will receive their Final Report Card on **June 23**.
